SUNDAY

Twenty six centuries ago, the kingdom of Judah, made up of the tribes of Benjamin and Judah, was ruled by good King Hezekiah. After a reign of thirteen years he became seriously ill and would have died, but he pleaded with God to lengthen his life. On the king's recovery, ambassadors from Babylon visited him. They had come to hear about the mighty God of Hezekiah that could heal the sick, but instead, he took them on a tour of his palace and showed them all the treasures he had accumulated.

Hezekiah had showed them his glory: he had not shown them God's glory.

Nebuchadnezzar did not only plan to train them for high office; he intended to slowly but surely cause them to exchange their faith in the living God for idolatry.

He would gradually get them to mix their belief with the idolatrous customs and heathen worship and get them to join in the fun and games of Babylon that appeared harmless; get them to feel indebted to him for his favor and, kindness and then he would have their slavish allegiance.

The crucial moment had come, "the king appointed them a daily portion of the king's meat and the wine which he drank. Daniel and his three friends had been trained in habits of strict temperance. Would their home training help them now that they had to choose between eating right and displeasing the king? Would their fear of

the king and respect for him cause them to eat and drink what they knew God had forbidden?' Would they choose to please the king and by so doing displease God? Or would they choose to do the right and suffer the consequences. whatever they might be?


SUNDAY

One year after Daniel and his friends graduated from the University of Babylon, King Nebuchadnezzar had an amazing dream.

The evening before the king had spent much time thinking about the glory of his kingdom, and fell asleep with a longing to know its future. In answer to his unspoken thoughts, the peace of his sleep that night was invaded and the future history of the world was spread out in clear detail before his wondering eyes.

On awakening, Nebuchadnezzar found that the dream was gone from him and tried as he might, he could not recall the details.

MONDAY

Failing to recall the dream, Nebuchadnezzar summoned all his wise men and magicians into his presence. He demanded that they both tell him the dream and give him the interpretation of it.

"I have dreamed a dreamed," he said perplexedly, "and my spirit is troubled to know the dream."

"Tell us the dream," they said anxiously," and we will tell you the interpretation."

Where now was the wisdom of the great teachers and magicians of Babylon? Could they make known what was hidden from ordinary eyes.

The king grew angry with their apparent failure. Said Nebuchadnezzar: "...if ye will not make known unto me the dream, with the interpretation thereof, ye shall be cut in pieces, and your houses made a dung hill." And Nebuchadnezzar had both the power and mind set to do it. These astrologers of Baby Ion pretended to read the future in the stars; the magicians pretended to heal diseases and change the course of events by magic and the use of divination which was nothing more than black magic or satanic power. But now all of these means failed them.

WEDNESDAY

There are in God's purposes, particular period when we must arise in response to God's call. The supreme moment had come to Daniel as it had done to Joseph and Moses and was to come for Queen Esther and John and a host of others. Someday too our supreme moment will come.

Daniel's early life and childhood education had been preparing him for this very moment that when faced with death, he could look up to God and claim His promise.

The king was careworn, and in great perplexity and anxiety, because the dream troubled him.

"Art thou able to tell me the dream which I have seen and the interpretation?" asked Nebuchadnezzar.

"The secret which you demand is beyond any man to know, but there is a God in heaven that reveals secrets, and will make known to you, what will come to pass."

REFLECT

THURSDAY

As Daniel began to recount the dream, King Nebuchadnezzar leaned forward on his throne anxious to catch every word spoken by the youth, who was so obviously filled with the Spirit of the God, whom the king did not know. The king caught every sentence and recognised it as the dream which had troubled him.



SUNDAY

The dream of the great image given to Nebuchadnezzar, reaches down to the end of time, as explained by God through Daniel. Not one of the wise men in Babylon could relate the dream, furthermore interpret it.

King Nebuchadnezzar acknowledged the power of God, saying to Daniel, "Of a truth it is, that your God is a God of gods ... and a revealer of secrets." Daniel 2: 47. For a time afterwards,

Nebuchadnezzar worshiped the God of Heaven, being influenced by fear. But while in his mind acknowledging the God of the Jews, his heart was still filled with worldly ambitions and a desire for self-exaltation. As Babylon became more and more prosperous, the king became more proud and boastful. In time he stopped worshiping God and returned to idol worship.

MONDAY

Twenty or more years had passed since God had given Nebuchadnezzar the dream of the image. These were twenty good years. The king had grown richer and all nations paid homage to Babylon. Money and goods flowed into Babylon from all over the world and Nebuchadnezzar beautified and strengthened his capital.

In interpreting the dream Daniel had said to Nebuchadnezzar, "Thou art this head of gold." The wise men of Babylon, taking advantage of the king's return to idolatry, and knowing his; ambition and love for display, suggested that he make an image similar to the one he had seen in his dream. He was to set it up where all might behold the head of gold which represented his kingdom.

DISCUSSION

Apart from the ideas given above, what might be the real reason why Nebuchadnezzar made the entire image of gold?

TUESDAY

King Nebuchadnezzar intended that contrary to what Daniels' God had said, his kingdom would last forever. What a vain and rebellious thought!

In the interpretation, Daniel had declared, "In the days of the kings, shall the God of heaven set up a kingdom, which shall never be destroyed and it shall stand forever."

The thought of establishing an empire that should endure forever appealed to Nebuchadnezzar. But he was fighting a battle against the words of the God of heaven. The men who advised him, had completely forgotten that it was Daniel and Daniel's God who had saved them from certain death. They revealed their unselfish hearts. They wanted power and supremacy and would, with the king, exalt Babylon as supreme and worthy of worldwide reverence.

Through this false image, Satan was seeking to make a mockery of God's purpose for the human race. The image was imposing, beautiful and priceless. It was about 90 feet tall and 9 feet in breath, and it commanded the wonder and applause of the people.

WEDNESDAY

The image of Gold was set up on a platform in the plain of Dura.

Nebuchadnezzar, with the advice of his "wise" men decided to consecrate this image as an object of worship. Accordingly, a decree from the king went out. On a certain day the image was to be dedicated and on this occasion all the officials and leading men in the empire were to be there worshipping the idol, to show allegiance to him, its designer and maker.

THURSDAY

It was God's plan to make the presence of the children of Israel in Babylon a blessing to all the nations. Satan hoped to defeat this purpose of God and so he led King Nebuchadnezzar to set tip the image, a command all the officials, including Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego had to obey. Indeed with Daniel absent from Babylon, Satan hoped to defeat the faith of these three boys, and so claim universal worship.

But God decreed otherwise!

When the music began to play and the herald commanded all to . fall in worship before the image these three boys refuse to bend their knees. They remained tall and straight like a ramrod. Their God was the true and living God, they would bow to none other. Their test had come and they would die rather than dishonour God.

King Nebuchadnezzar sat pleased on his royal throne, in his royal pavilion, flushed with the glory that comes from the worship of men. Then certain of the wise men, jealous of the positions these boys held, brought word to Nebuchadnezzar that the Hebrew boys refused to obey his royal decree.

Sensing that something unusual might happen to save them, he ordered his strongest men to bind them hand and foot and throw them into the fiery furnace.

Into the fire they fell and stood. There, standing, they met their Saviour, the Lord Jesus Christ, in person and together they walked and talked in the midst of the fire. What's this; a fiery furnace that should have burnt them up in an instant, or was it a day at the beach?

Will Winslow was from a well-to-do family but he was the worst boy in the village. His dad had neglected his training and, so he was a most disagreeable child. He was abusive and very disrespectful, particularly to the old and the cripple.

One poor old woman who was bent with age, was his particular object of ridicule and mocking. "Look at her," he would say, "isn't she like the letter's' with an extra crook in it?'" Then he would laugh as he followed closely behind her, mocking an imitating her disfigured body and painful walk.

"Shame on you!" said Charles Mansfield, "to laugh at her because of her misfortune."

"If! looked like that I would not stay among people!" said Will.

Not many days after, Will Winslow dashed from a detention when his teacher's back was turned. He rushes on to the playing field exclaiming triumphantly, "Now let him punish me again, if he can!" As he said this he ran backwards and to the horror of those boys present, he fell into an open well that was under repairs.

The well was deep but Charles Mansfield decided to climb down. Carefully he lifted Will's limp and disfigured body with one hand. With the other upon a rope he carefully climbed out. The old crippled lady had witnessed the fall and hurried upon her crutch to the scene. Will was taken to her humble home and upon the lowly bed of the same woman whom he had mocked and ridiculed, he laid as if dead.

A doctor was called and he was examined. But poor Will, his once youthful, lithe body, was now broken and distorted with an ugly scar upon his forehead, stark reminder of pride that goes before a fall.

MONDAY

King Nebuchadnezzar had been favorably impressed by the faithfulness of Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego in the face of death. He was more impressed when the Son of God went with them into the fire to save them out of it, so that not a hair of their head was singed, nor was the scent of smoke on them. In fact, so impressed and humbled was Nebuchadnezzar, that he immediately made a law "that every people, nation and language, which speak anything amiss against the God of Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego, shall be cut in pieces and their houses shall be made a dung hill."

Regrettably this favorable impression and attitude by Nebuchadnezzar did not last. The king was naturally ambitious and proud-spirited and he always indulged feelings of self - importance. Was he not called "the terrible of the nations" and "the hammer of God." All his victories he claimed for his gods. It should not be surprising then that he should be tempted to turn aside from humility, which leads to true greatness.

TUESDAY

God must have loved the man Nebuchadnezzar very much. In mercy he gave the king another dream, to warn him of the danger and of the snare that Satan had laid for his ruin. What a merciful and kind Father! And to think that the king was a stubborn old heathen!

The king could remember this dream but he could not understand its meaning. Greatly troubled by it he again, just as in former times, called for his soothsayers and wisemen. And of course with the dream all told in clear and simple language they ought to be able to interpret it. Nebuchadnezzar did not think to send for Daniel. To the king's great amazement and greater annoyance, not one of the supposed wisemen could interpret it. The king in his perplexity sent for his faithful servant Daniel.

This was due in a great measure to the simplicity of their habits and temperance in eating. The Medes were not unknown to the Jews; for four hundred years earlier, the Assyrians had carried away Jews into Assyria and scattered them among the Medes. This contact permitted the Medes to have some knowledge of God and this may be why, though heathen, they never fell into the wicked forms of idolatry found in Babylon. MONDAY

The first ruler of the Median-Persian empire was King Darius. He immediately began the work of reorganising the Government. This reorganisation was to cause deadly jealousy and hatred from the start, but God over-ruled it for His glory and praise.

When the army of the Medo-Persian sacked Babylon, they put all of the royal family and chief men to the sword. Daniel, who at the time of assault was in the city, was saved alive, no doubt providentially. It may also be that the Medo-Persian intelligence had information on Daniel as being an upright and honest counsellor. No doubt Darius wanted men around him who knew the affairs of Babylon and men whom he could trust with state affairs.

Darius selected one hundred and twenty princes and set them over the provinces of his empire. Over these, he set three presidents, of whom Daniel was the first. Daniel was made first among equals because an "excellent" spirit was in him.

Ignorant of the hidden motive of the princes, the king did not realise the hatred they had for Daniel, and, yielding to their flattery, he signed the decree.

THURSDAY

The enemies of Daniel left the king's presence rejoicing over the trap they had seemingly laid for the servant of God. And of course, Satan was the real brains behind the plot all along.

For one, he hates freedom of conscience and religious liberty. He hated it then and he hates it the more now. Daniel was high in command and in the favour of the king and people, and Satan feared his influence would weaken his control over the rulers and the people of the nation.

Imagine Satan fearing a man! And indeed he needed to fear. For this man did not fear to stand alone with God against all the evil men and evil angels around him. It was the satanic agencies that stirred the princes to envy and jealousy; it was they who inspired the plan for Daniel's destruction.

When Daniel knew the decree was signed, he opened his windows three times a day, as usual towards Jerusalem and prayed. Why should he cease to pray now, when he most needed to pray? He would rather die first than give up communion with his God.

With calmness he performed his duties and at the time of prayer he went into his chamber, and with windows opened, he offered his petition to the God of heaven as usual.

SUNDAY

The seventh chapter of Daniel begins very simply and matter-of-factly. Yet it develops into one of the most beautiful prophecies found anywhere in the bible. It begins with some terrible and ravenous breast that preyed upon God's people down through history. It ends with the wonderful judgment scene which vindicated God's government, His people and His love, and shows God's justice in consigning all these evil powers including the little horn power to the flames of hell. The Climax is the saints inheriting a kingdom which is everlasting.

Chapter 7 also serves as the dividing line between the first half and the second half of the book of Daniel.

By now it should be realized that the first six chapters deal with the

kingdom of Babylon in particular at the time when the prophet Daniel lived and served in the courts of Babylon. The seventh chapter onward to the twelfth, reveal the future of God's people, not only of the Jews, but God's true, Spiritual, people, remnant church. (Rev. 14: 12)

At the time of this vision, prophet Daniel was about eighty five years of age; he had therefore spent some sixty seven years in Babylon, holding high the light of God's truth and character, not only to Babylon but to the then known world.

This vision was the first of four that Daniel was to receive. While Daniel 2 and 7 are quiet similar, it is most useful to work out the differences.

For example:

Daniel 2 was given to a pagan king

Daniel 7 was given to a man of God.

Daniel 2 portrays history of nature as man would view it, glorious and. glamorous.

Daniel 7 portrays history of nature and man as God sees it, one rebellion after the next.

Daniel 2 reveals nations as they are outwardly in their supposed glory.

Daniel 7 reveals them as they are inwardly, wild, ungodly and self seeking.

Further, Daniel 7 reveals information about a wicked world ruler at the end of time, who disguised as a religious person, would really be blasphemous and tyrannical.

In the vision, the animals did not leave the scene but remained as the succeeding ones arose. This is an important point to notice, what is the importance? As each kingdom was succeeded by another, its influence lingered and became incorporated into the other. Babylon's pride and evil-religion remained to pollute the Medo-Persian kingdom; Medo-Persian cruelty remained and corrupted the otherwise cultured Greek civilisation.

Greek education and etiquette remained to add culture and refinement to the otherwise crude Roman kingdom.

WEDNESDAY

Neither lions nor leopards have wings, nor do bears walk around with ribs in their mouth. As for the fourth beast, it was unlike anything known to man and horror of horrors it devoured and broke in pieces and trample the people of God with its feet. On its head were horns and one horn which uprooted three to make room for itself, had eyes and mouth and it could speak. What a terror!

Each peculiar feature arrested Daniel's attention.

History itself verifies both the existence of these four kingdoms and their kings. It also confirms the nature of these beast kingdoms as shown to Daniel in his night vision.

For example, history shows that the lion was the national symbol of Babylon; that Medo-Persia was a cruel kingdom; that Alexander, the first king of the united Greek empire conquered nations with a speed that defied the imagination; that the fourth kingdom, Rome, was divided into the ten kingdoms of Europe.

You would have notice that Daniel's vision angel passed swiftly over the first three kingdoms, lightly touching them. When it came to the fourth, a beast "dreadful and terrible," and strong exceeding," Daniel was

LESSON 8

Daniel Sees the Judgment

KEY TEXT

"And he said unto me, unto two thousand and three hundred days; then shall the sanctuary be cleansed. "Daniel 8: 14.

OBJECTIVES

- 1. Correlate Daniel 8:1-13 with Daniel 2, 7:1-13
- 2. Identify the little horn of Daniel 8.
- 3. Explain what is meant by the cleansing of the sanctuary.

IN DEPTH

Daniel 8, Great Controversy p. 409; Prophet and Kings p. 554.

SUNDAY

The eighth chapter of Daniel introduces us to the second vision of Daniel. This vision took place at Shushan 551 BC two years after the one recorded in Daniel 7.

This chapter reviews the history of kingdom number two and three, and predicts the persecution of God's people by pagan Rome and papal Rome.

The chapters ends with the remarkable prophecy of the cleansing of the sanctuary in heaven. This prophecy is further amplified in Daniel 9.

MONDAY
In this vision Daniel first sees a ram. This ram was pushing northward and southward and west-ward. It had two horns as most rams do, but what was startling was that the horn that came up last grew much higher than the first.
No one could stand before him; this ram did as it pleased. When he attacked another animal, there was no one who could deliver out of his hand. What a prized ram!

HISTORICAL NOTE

Darius who was the king of the Medo Persian Empire which succeeded the kingdom of Babylon in 539 - 537 B.C. (Dan. 5: 30, 31) was an old man at the time of conquest. He ruled for two years and was succeeded by Cyrus, Commander of the army and whom some believe to, have been Darius' grandson.

After Darius' death, Cyrus who took over as king became very important as the Persian element of the kingdom. He became showy and very dominant. In fact, it was the Persian rulers who conquered, westward, northward and southward.

TUESDAY

As Daniel watched the parade of the ram, his attention was suddenly arrested by a he-goat. This he-goat came in from the west, the direction opposite the ram. It moved in so fast that the prophesy said, it "touched not the ground." Daniel 8:5.

HISTORICAL NOTE

Alexander showed remarkable qualities of leadership while yet a lad. As a general of his army, he led by example and once he decided on an objective; nothing could turn him back.


He always seemed to know what to do and it was this that inspired his men. Thus the strength of his army did not lie in numbers but in his great courage, decisiveness and tactic on the battle field.

These are qualifications for the christian soldiers to consider, especially in the last days.

WEDNESDAY

Daniel became more engrossed as he saw the he-goat, youthful and nimble tested the air and spotted the parading ram. What a suspenseful picture this must have been. Daniel watched the drama unfold as the he-goat as it were flew over the land, towards, the ram, who a moment ago had been parading. The ram went out in fine style to meet the he-goat. There must have a violent clash time and time again, as the he-goat plunged its single horn into the vitals of the helpless ram. The bible says, "there was none who could deliver the ram out of his hands." The thrill of victory! The anguish of defeat When the dust cleared the ram laid broken and dead on the ground. The kingdom that had shown wonderful strength, collapsed and fell. She had passed her probation and filled up the cup of her iniquity. God had given 'Persia every advantage, but finally Persia turned from God and fell victim to Greece, even as Babylon had fallen victim to her. The he-goat itself grew fat, but when he had grown to a quick size and strong, the great horn was broken.

To Daniel's amazement, four horns grew out of the broken one. One facing the north, another to the south, and the others east and west. To Daniel's utter amazement and alarm, out of one of the four horns, the western one, sprang a little horn. (This will be the subject of tomorrow's lesson).

HISTORICAL NOTE

Alexander died at age thirty three of a violent fever brought on by a drunken stupor in Mayor June 323 B.C. He was in the pride of his life, strong and vigorous and at the height of his career. Thus it truly came to pass as Daniel had foretold, "when he was strong, the great horn was broken." Furthermore, having died without leaving an heir, his four great generals-were left to divide the empire among themselves. These were the four horns seen to arise from the broken one. How accurate the prophecy!

THURSDAY

"Out of one of them came forth a little horn which waxed exceedingly great."

The picture of a little horn appears both in chapter 7 and 8 of Daniel. Who or what is he representative of? Note that this is the only power that the word exceedingly great is applied.

HISTORICAL NOTE

Both history and Daniel's prophecy show that:

- 1. Greece was succeeded by Rome (Dan. 2: 7).
- 2. Rome arose in the western half of the four Grecian empire (Dan. 8: 9).
- 3. Rome persecuted and martyred millions of christians and their leaders. (horn and stars), Dan. 12: 1,2.
- 4. Rome crucified Christ (Act 4: 21, 26).

But the little horn was not just another empire like Greece or Persia. When Barbarian sacked the Roman empire in 476 RC., the church at Rome inherited the power and authority and place of the Roman empire in history. Between 476 and 538 it uprooted three of the ten (1) horns. (see Dan. 7: 8,24). It laboured for its place among the nations of Europe; a place which, it held between 538 AD and 1798 (1260 years); or "time, times and dividing of time (Dan 7: 25)

A time = 1 year; times = 2 years; dividing or half a time = Y2 year (i.e. 3'/Z years)

In prophecy 1 day = 1 year (see Num. 14: 34) :.3 Z years = 3 z years or (360 + 720 + 180) = 1260 days/years.

FRIDAY

In Dan. 8: 13 a question was asked, "how long shall the sanctuary and the host be trodden under foot." That is, how long would Satan and the false religion, persecute God's people, His truth, His temple and High Priestly ministry?

The answer came back "unto two thousand and three hundred days, then shall the sanctuary be cleanse."

This is, at the end of this period, Christ high priestly ministry in heaven

would be brought back to people's minds. They would understand the work and Christ would begin cleansing the sanctuary and people in the act of final atonement. This is the work that the early Adventists called to the people's attention in 1843-1844.

What is this sanctuary and what is involved in its cleansing? (see lesson 9 and 10, Quarter 1, 1997. We Worship You).

The earthly sanctuary build by Moses and temples built by Solomon and Herod were cleansed each year. Once a year the high priest entered the most holy place and offered atonement for himself and the people and for the tabernacle. This act of atonement removed in figure, sin from the people and tabernacle and so cleansed them.

In the heavenly sanctuary, our High Priest entered the most holy place once (Heb. 9: 26) to do the same work for us and the sanctuary making final atonement and final cleansing for us.

This work begin in 1844 (Dan. 8: 14). When it is finished, He will 'Come for his cleansed, waiting people.

Just as the Jews on the day of atonement confessed all their sin and.

put them all away before the high priest left the temple, so are we to confess, put away all sin, put an end to sin in our lives. Then the High Priest will blot out all our sin and write pardon beside our names.

The work of final atonement or cleansing began in 1844. (Dan. 8: 14). When it is finished Jesus will come.

The History of the Jews

SUNDAY

Daniel chapter 9, begins with Daniel praying for his people, the Jews. Daniel was not only a renown statesman, and an astute, businessman, but he was above all else a student of the word of God and a shepherd of his people who were exiled in Babylon.

Amidst all the clamour of court life and the clash of empires, Daniel took time for study and reflection on God's mercies and promises to his people. So in the very first year of Darius' reign, Daniel through prayer and the study of the prophecies of Jeremiah, came to understand that the seventy years of captivity for the Jews were almost at an end.

Daniel however did not say, "well, the Lord has promised that He would cause us to return home at the end of the 70 years, so I'll fold my hands, and let Him do so."

No! Daniel understood the principles that "God does nothing save through the prayers of his people," and that "Gad cannot act for His people if they are indifferent and too indolent: to persevere in prayer for fulfillment of these promises.

MONDAY

While Daniel was yet praying, angel Gabriel who stands in God's presence and who Daniel had seen before, now returned. Gabriel had left off speaking to Daniel in chapter 8:20 but returned to give Daniel skill and understanding about that said vision.

In Daniel 8: 14, in answer to a question asked by a "saint", Gabriel gave Daniel the answer "unto two thousand three hundred days, then shall the sanctuary be cleansed." This king (Dan. 8:23-26) would destroy God's people by peace and would even stand up against Prince and princes, even Jesus. As Daniel looked upon the work of this king he had fainted. On reviving he or no one else could understand the vision.

TUESDAY

In response to his prayer in Daniel 9 which took place some thirteen years after the vision in Daniel 8, the angel Gabriel returns to give him skill and understanding in the vision. God does nothing before its time. He always acts in the fullness of time. Thirteen years had passed, but as soon as God saw Daniel bend his knees and spirit in prayer in regards to end of the Jews captivity. He commissioned Gabriel to fly swiftly to give understanding to Daniel that he might understand God's plan for them as a people.

There must be countless light years between God's throne and earth. But Gabriel covered the distance in record time. He reached Daniel before he had finished praying.

God loved His people. He had big plans for them but they must be willing to comply with His terms if these big plans were to benefit them.

Through Daniel He gave them a deadline and specific instructions as what to do if they were to remain in His favour. In order to recognise the Messiah when He came, and to share in the benefits of His coming, they would have to do as instructed.

THURSDAY

That His people may not be deceived; that they would know the Messiah and the time of his coming, God kindly gave them through Daniel, unmistakable milestones. These sign posts acted as milestones and beacons along the route till the time of the Messiah's first advent. In fact these are undeniable proofs that Jesus of Nazareth

is the Christ. Daniel 9: 25 states "know ye therefore" i.e. be assured; know for sure. In other words the date of the promulgation of the commandment to restore and rebuild Jerusalem would serve as the first marker or the starting date for both the reckoning of the 70 years of the Jewish probation and the start of the 2,300 days.

Thus:

70 weeks cut off Or 490 years (70 x 7)

1810 years left (2300 - 49 0)

2300 day /years

It is important to note that the word "determined in verse 24 really means "cut off. In other words the 70 years are cut off from something and what else could it be but the 2300 day (Dan.9:2223).


FRIDAY

But what does this prophecy about the Jews have to do with us, today? EVERYTHING!

Let us understand as Daniel did and so succeed where the Jews failed.

First, the starting date of the 2300 days/70 weeks was 457 B.C. According to Ezra 6: 14 King Artaxerxes gave the third of ,three commands to rebuild and restore Jerusalem. This was in the autumn of 457 B.C. when Ezra was a scribe in the Medo- Persia Court of Artaxerxes.

Two former decrees had been made, one by King Cyrus (537 B.C.) who conquered Babylon in 539 B.C. (see Ezra 1:1-3). The other was made by Darius a Persian king in 519 B.c. These, two decrees resulted in work on the rebuilding of the temple. (see Ezra 6:1-3, 11, 12).

More specific a ally of the church as she goes through tough times in the last days of earth's history. At the end Michael, the commander of God's people will stand up and save His people. In Daniel 8, this vision caused Daniel much concern and hence much meditation and prayer. God had been good. He had cared for Daniel in every crisis, answering his prayer, and using him to bless his generation.

But now a new crisis had developed again. Work on the temple in Jerusalem so recently restarted by order of Cyrus, had stopped. Characteristically, Daniel fell to his knees. He prayed instead of despairing and complaining.

So great was his concern that Daniel finds himself by the river Hidekel after prayer and fasting for three full weeks.

SUNDAY

Dan. Chapters 10, 11, 12 form a complete package of which Chapter 10 is an introduction and Chapter 11 a continuation. Chapter 11, begins with Gabriel recounting his work in the reign of Darius to get Daniel's people, the Jews return to Jerusalem. It was for this reason that Darius had been born (Dan. 6:25, 26).


The vision of Daniel begins with the kingdom of Persia for the kingdom of Babylon had cease to exist for some five years at the time of this vision

One main difference you need to note between the vision of Daniel 11 and the other visions in Daniel, is that this vision talks quite often about individual "kings" and people. In other visions "King" means "kingdom" but here "king" often means "king."

One other important point of note is the term King of the South and King of the North. At first these terms literally refers to Kings of Syria and Egypt, countries lying North and South of Jerusalem.

In verse 2 we are introduced to four kings. that shall rise in Persia. The first three are Cambyses son of Cyrus; Smerdis, an impostor and Darius Hystaspes. The fourth which shall be for richer than they all is Xerxes, son of Darius Hystaspes an husband of the famed Queen Esther of the Jews. He was determined to crush the Greeks and organised an army of 5,283,220 men. He fought Greece successfully but was later overthrown by the same.

Daniel 11:3-13

Verses 3-13 of Daniel 11 bring us in a nutshell to the rise and fall of the power that shall succeed Persia. This power is none other than Greece.

Verse 3 tells us of a mighty king that shall stand up and rule with great dominion. This is the famous Alexander the Great.

After his death his dominion was divided into 4 parts, not to his posterity but by his four leading generals, namely, Cassander, Lysimachus, Seleucus and Ptolemy. These in turn conquered each other as Lysimachus conquered Cassander's dominion and Seleucus conquered Lysimachus. This left Ptolemy in the South and Seleucus in the North. From henceforth there is war between the King of the North and the King of the South.

A characteristic of Egypt, is her denial of the God of the universe. Pharaoh once asked in response to a message brought by Moses in the name of the Lord, "Who is Jehovah, that I should hearkeu unto His voice to let Israel go?" Ex. 5:2. A.R.V. This is atheism.

In Dan. 11:40 we have this power the king of the south coming back at the king of the north (Papacy) or Great Babylon and the king of the north conquering with all the might, power and riches at her disposal. So overwhelming is her victory over the King of the South that her associates in atheism is taken with her.

The bible tells us that we now live in the period when atheism reigns but the papacy and false religions is steadily regaining control. This overwhelming victory will be completely fulfilled when the second best of Rev. 13: 11-18 cause all to receive the mark, name and number of the first beast. But "tidings out of the East and out of the North shall trouble him." (ie. King of the North) Dan. 11:44. " yet he shall come to his end and none shall help him." Dan. 11:45.
